

Average rooftop solar storage price per 10MW in Serbia

What is Serbia solar PV?

Will Serbia develop a solar power plant?

The Serbian government is seeking a strategic partner to develop at least five PV plants with a cumulative capacity of 1 GW/1.2 GWh and at least 200 MW/400 MWh of battery energy storage. State power company Elektroprivreda Srbije (EPS) will own and operate the assets.

How will solar projects be supported in Serbia?

The projects will be supported through contracts for difference for 15 years. The Serbian government has allocated a quota of 50 MW for its first solar auction. Solar plants with capacity of more than 500 kW will be allowed to participate in the competitive tendering process, with the ceiling price set at EUR90 (\$96.10)/MWh.

What is UGT renewables Serbia solar?

UGT Renewables Serbia Solar is a ground-mounted solar project, which is planned over 2,000 hectares.
